Dear Mr. Brown:

Thank you for your research request and check received a few days ago for research on your ancestors.

I found an abstract of William D. Hill's will in <u>The Wills of</u> <u>Amherst County, VA. 1761-1865</u> by Rev. B. F. Davis. The children of William D. and Nancy Hill, his wife, are listed in this will. See copy #1.

I found William D. Hill mentioned a few times in the abstracts of <u>The Deeds of Amherst County, Virginia 1761-1807</u> and also in <u>The Deeds</u> of <u>Amherst County, Virginia 1807-1827</u>, both by the The Rev. Bailey F. Davis. See copies #2 - #6. These show that Wm. D. Hill owned land in Amherst County.

There is a Will D. HIll listed in the <u>Index To The 1820 Census of</u> <u>Virginia by</u> Jeanne R. Felldin, as living in Amherst County. See Copy #2. This seems to be your William D. Hill, but it is not certain. However, you can send for a copy of the census entry which would give more detail about him and his family. "For a small fee the National Archives will search for your ancestor's name and furnish you with a copy of the census entry. This institution, however, is limited to a seventy-five page search. For GSA Form 7029, write the National Archives and Records Service, Washington, D. C. 20408." This is from <u>Index To The 1820 Census of Virginia</u> by Jeanne R. Felldin.

I regret I could not find more on Wm. D. Hill in our resources but hope the enclosed information will be helpful to you.
