The foregoing Declaration of David Hopkins, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June the 7th 1832 was sworn to in open Court by the said David Hopkins. And also the affidavit of Isaac West and the certificate of Hiram Duley and Daniel Ticklins was also sworn to in open Court.

And the said Court do hereby declare their opinion after the investigation of the matter, and after sending the interrogatories prescribed by the War Department, that the above named applicant was a revolutionary soldier, and served as he states. And the Court further certifies, that it appears to them, that Hiram Duley who has signed the preceding certificate is a clergyman, resident in the County of Fleming, and that Daniel Ticklins who has also signed the same is a resident in the said County and is a credible person, and that their statement is entitled to credit.

I Leander D. Stockton, clerk of the Court, for the Circuit aforesaid, do hereby certify that the foregoing contains the original proceedings of the said Court in the matter of the application of David Hopkins for a pension.
